

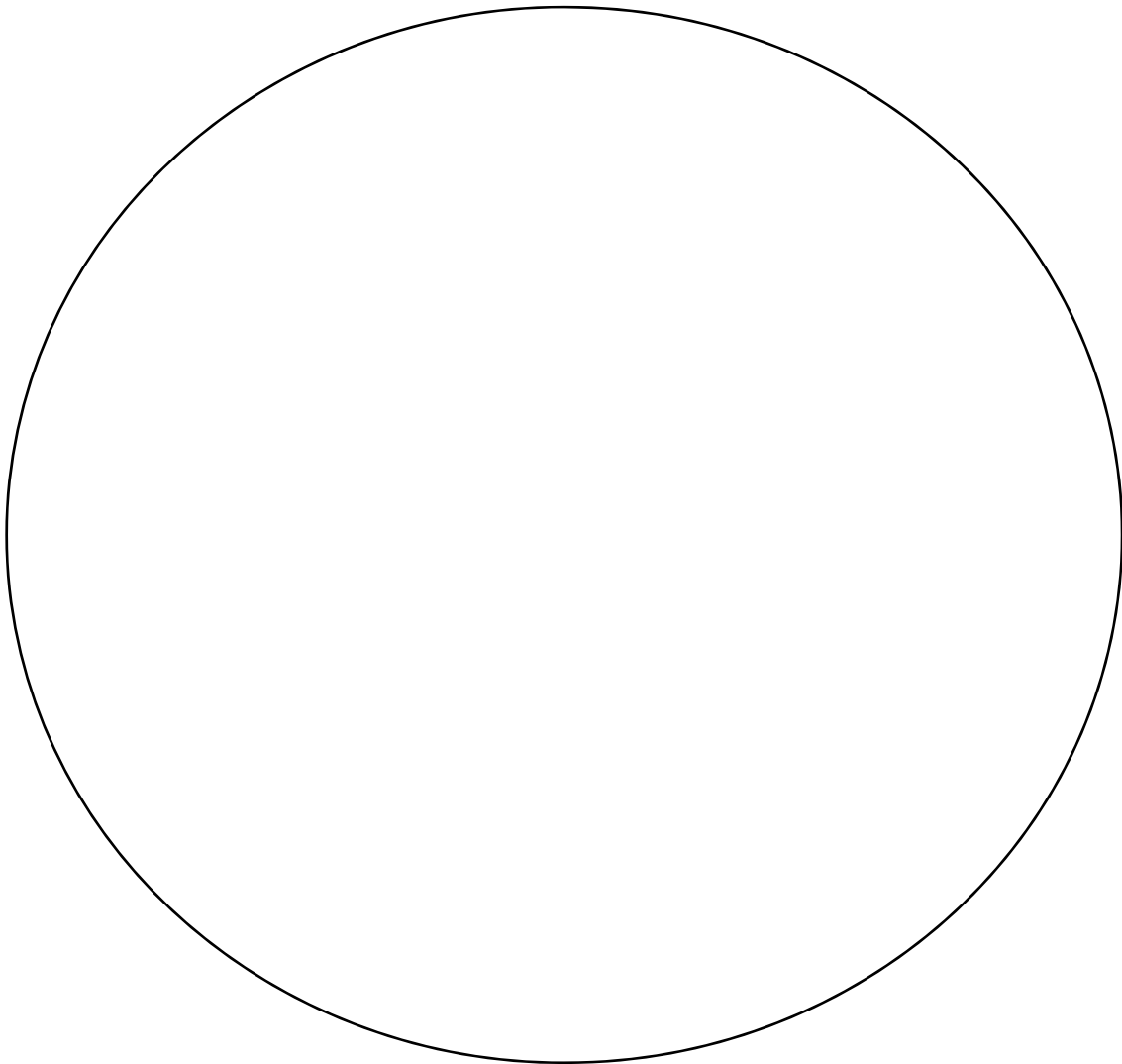

Looking Back at the Play: Who's to blame?

Part 1 Directions: Create a pie chart in the circle below to show who or what may have been to blame for the deaths of Romeo and Juliet. Consider major characters, ideas (ex: fate), and other aspects of Renaissance life that we have discussed (children's upbringing, social status, role of religion/religious undertones, etc.). Give each section a percentage of blame, making sure that after you've divided everything up, the entire chart totals 100%. The lower the percentage, the lower amount of blame you are placing on that person/idea. The higher the percentage, the more blame you are assigning to that person/idea.



Part 2 Directions: For each "slice" of your pie chart, write an explanation as to how you came to that conclusion. **Be sure to explain IN DETAIL using information FROM THE PLAY or class discussions!** Use a separate sheet of paper for your work, and attach your work to this sheet.
